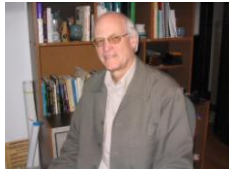

## **Toward Citizenship: How a New Story is Emerging in Ontario John Lord**

In this keynote address, John Lord will explore how the world is changing. From the U.N. Convention to the Ontario Social Inclusion Act, the next generation of families are expecting inclusive lives for their sons and daughters. John will describe how a New Story is emerging in Ontario, with citizenship at the core. He will challenge us to consider key elements that need to be in place to enable people with disabilities to be full participants and contributors to our communities.

**John Lord** is a researcher, author, and family member. He has published widely on issues related to innovative community supports and social inclusion. He is the co-author of *Pathways to Inclusion: Building a New Story with People and Communities*. His newest book is *Friends and Inclusion*. He is currently a partner in the Facilitation Leadership Group, and is involved with training and consultation with communities that want to build a New Story. He is also the founding director of the Centre for Community Based Research in Kitchener.



## **Five Approaches to Building Relationships: The Power of Friends and Inclusion Peggy Hutchison, Karen Lord, and John Lord**

In this session, participants will learn how one family has utilized five different approaches to building relationships with their daughter who has a disability. Based on research and years of experience, Peggy, John and their daughter Karen will outline each approach and its strengths and limitations. Using photos and stories of Karen's life, participants will be inspired to build relationships in all aspects of their own lives. Peggy, John, and Karen's new book *Friends and Inclusion* will be available to purchase at this session.

**Peggy Hutchison** is a retired professor at Brock University and a former advisor of a local People First group. She is co-author of *Pathways to Inclusion: Building a New Story with People and Communities*. **Karen Lord** is very involved in her community of Kitchener-Waterloo, where she teaches yoga and works in a cafe. **John Lord** is a researcher, author, and facilitator. Peggy and John are Karen's parents - the three of them have co-authored a new book that is being released this October -- *Friends and Inclusion: Five Approaches to Building Relationships*.
